For Geography department owns self-sufficient laboratory.
- 4. ICT Infrastructure: Few classrooms are provided with all necessary ICT equipment. All the ICT paraphernalia is maintained and supported by the department of BCA.
- 5. Physical Facilities: All the physical facilities required in the classrooms such as LCD projectors, tables, lecterns, teaching aids like maps, megaphones, mike system, Xeroxing handouts, charts, lockers, stationary material, etc. are provided.

- 4. ICT Infrastructure: Few classrooms are provided with all necessary ICT equipment. All the ICT paraphernalia is maintained and supported by the department of BCA.
- 5. Physical Facilities: All the physical facilities required in the classrooms such as LCD projectors, tables, lecterns, teaching aids like maps, megaphones, mike system, Xeroxing hand-outs, charts, lockers, stationary material, etc. are
